Years 3, 4, 5 & 6

Team Size 5 players on the pitch (Minimum of 2 girls) 1 substitute (rotating after

each game if desired)

Gender Criteria Minimum 2 girls on court for each game

Format Rotation Principle (Round Robin)

Duration Each match will consist of 3 games. The match will be decided best out of

3 (First to two).

Equipment Players must be wearing appropriate PE kit

Awards Certificate for all participants

Dodgeball Rules

Teams:

• 5 Players on the court at the start of the game. There must be a minimum of 2 girls on the court at all times.

Field of Play

- The Field of play is rectangular.
- It will be played on a regulation badminton court (44ft long by 20ft wide)

Rules Summary:

- A match is a set of 3. (First to 2)
- Games last for a maximum of 2minutes (Could differ on night)
- 3 Balls are positioned on the centreline at the start of a game
- A game begins when signalled by the referee
- At a game's start, a maximum of 3 players from each team run to gain possession of the balls. Balls must be passed/carried behind the attack line before an attempt is made

- The leading team, in the game, has 5 seconds to throw balls at their opponents, when they have possession of the majority of the balls. Teams can always retain possession of 1 ball
- A catch brings a player back into the game in rotation F.O.F.I (First Out First In)
- A player may use a ball in their possession to block a ball thrown at them
- Headshots do not count (Unless you are crouched)
- Substitutions are allowed between each 2-minute game
- If a ball hits the floor, wall, player or any other surface the ball becomes immediately dead

You are out when:

- When a ball hits you directly, which is thrown by an opponent
- When an opposing player catches your throw
- When you step into the dead zone or over a boundary line
- When the ball is knocked from your hands when you try to block a throw

How to win a game of dodgeball:

A game is won by putting out all the opposing team, or by having more players left on court at the end of the 2-minute game.
