Overall

An apprenticeship is a structured programme where you will spend approximately 80% of your time working and 20% in training. This combination allows for 100% learning over a period of 18 to 24 months. During the apprenticeship, you will receive specific development to role, acquire relevant qualifications, and gain valuable experience. With the ultimate goal to become a fully qualified bike instructor and multi sports schools coach capable of delivering the national standards to young people.

Main Responsibilities and Tasks

- o Complete all aspects of the apprenticeship, including work assignments and coordination with the training provider to access training sessions.
- o Participate actively in training and personal development opportunities to enhance skills and knowledge.
- Learn and master the delivery of high-quality cycling instruction to young people, adhering to national standards.
- o Conduct thorough checks to assess risks to trainees, bicycles, and training environments, including on-road locations, to ensure a safe learning experience.
- o Adhere to all health and safety policies and procedures, maintain vigilance in safeguarding practices, and follow protocols for accident and incident reporting.
- o Educate trainees on safe cycling practices, promoting cycling as a sustainable mode of transportation and a fun, health-beneficial activity.
- o Support the organisation in providing high-quality physical education, sports, and competitive events for young people.
- o Assist and teach in PE lessons, deliver high-quality extracurricular clubs, and support the delivery of PE and sports projects.
- o Ensure timely completion of internal monitoring tasks, including attendance registers, assessments, and results, adhering to deadlines and compliance with GDPR for data protection.
- o Be adaptable to flexible working hours, which may include evenings, weekends, and school holidays, to meet the programme's needs.
- Perform additional duties as needed, in line with the job's grade and as directed by the Manager/Director.
